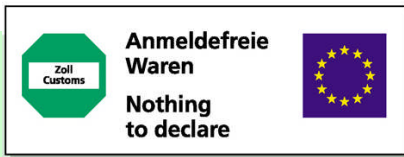


Your Way Through Customs

The Main Customs Office gives notice of the following:



If you are only bringing in goods described below as **duty-free** or if you were on an **intra-EU flight**, please use the **green Exit**.

Duty free are:

- **personal belongings** for use or consumption on your trip
- **products** from a **member state** of the **European Union**
- **travel souvenirs** and **gifts** from other countries (third countries) or products bought in duty-free shops, on board an aircraft or on the Canary Islands with the following maximum limitations:
 - **Tobacco products**
(imported by travellers of at least 17 years of age)
200 cigarettes or
100 cigarillos or
50 cigars or
250 grams of smoking tobacco or a proportional assortment of these products
 - **Alcohol and alcoholic beverages**
(imported by travellers of at least 17 years of age)
1 litre of spirits of an alcoholic strength exceeding 22% vol or undenaturated ethyl alcohol of an alcoholic strength exceeding 80 % vol or

2 litres of spirit of an alcoholic strength not exceeding 22 % vol or a proportional assortment of these products and

4 litres of still wine and

16 litres of beer
 - **Other products**
of an aggregated value of not more than 430,- €;
travellers under 15 years of age: an aggregated value of not more than 175,- €



If you are bringing in more or other goods than those specified on the left, please use the **red Exit** and declare the goods to the Customs Officer.

-Always to be declared:

- **Goods brought in for sale or any other commercial purpose, as well as**
- **goods, for which the import is prohibited or subject to restrictions, such as drugs, firearms and ammunition**
- **protected plants and animals**

Cash or equivalent means of payment are to be declared to the customer or Federal Police officers upon request, should their value amount to 10.000 € or more.
